SCL Advent 2024



This month students will be preparing for the birth of Jesus with the theme:

Let's be Advent Angels. Students will be learning about angels, reading/reflecting on Scripture that involves angels, and doing acts of kindness and service to be like angels. Preparations began last month when our school "families" gathered on the feast of St. Catherine Labouré and the students made angels that will be displayed throughout the school to help us stay focused on being Advent Angels.

Since Advent is a time of preparing for the birth of a child, our two service projects are aimed at helping children. First, we will be supporting *Angels' Arms*, an organization that helps families with foster children in the St. Louis area. They asked us to collect various types of food for these families and to help keep their shelves balanced, each grade has been assigned a specific item.

During our 1st Advent prayer service we challenged the students to do an act of service (something extra/age appropriate) to EARN the funds to purchase the food. We want the STUDENTS involved- as it is THEIR project from which to learn/grow.



What is the Luke 18 Retreat? This is a retreat for teens delivered by teens. It is a great way to make new friends, connect with your classmates on a deeper level, have a ton of fun, and gain perspective from high school teens on their journey as a teen...struggles, celebrations, prayer, and faith. This retreat is built upon the bible verse Luke 18:16: "But Jesus called the children to him and said, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these."

The retreat starts on Friday night and ends after Noon Mass on Sunday. Because the retreat experience builds and deepens throughout the weekend, participants are **not allowed** to leave during the weekend to attend sports or other events (no exceptions). (Please keep in mind, however, we choose this weekend as it is typically one that has few scheduled sporting events.) Space is limited, so don't wait too long to sign up!

<u>Will I go home each night?</u> Luke 18 participants will stay overnight at parish sleephouses. They will be supervised by junior/senior high school teen leaders each night. Parents, if you are interested in learning more about what it means to be a sleephouse for 6-8 male or female teens and their leaders, please let us know. You will not typically have your own child in your home.

We understand that schedules can get busy, but we encourage you to prioritize this retreat as a unique opportunity for you on your faith journey. We are excited, we are getting ready, and we can't wait to share this experience with you.
