In the tech class, the 8th-grade students were tasked with coming up with their own game concepts—anything from board games to tabletop games. With the help of 3D printers, they brought their ideas to life by designing and printing out game pieces, tokens, boards, and more. The excitement didn't stop at the 8th graders, though. Once the games were ready, the students decided to share their creations with the second grader classes. The younger students were thrilled to test out the games, diving into the hands-on experiences that the 8th graders had meticulously crafted.

5th grade students used hands-on investigation to discover the mechanism by which their muscles control their bones to move their bodies. They constructed a model of a human finger and observed how pulling on a string, which represented a tendon, causes it to bend at the joints.



## Workshop for Parents


### MARCH 11TH AT 6:30PM SCL PARISH CENTER
