SLUH Math Competition

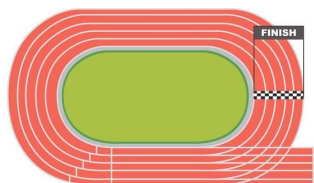
We sent two 8th grade teams and one 7th grade team to the SLUH middle school math competition. One 8th grade team won 1st place! Way to go SCL!

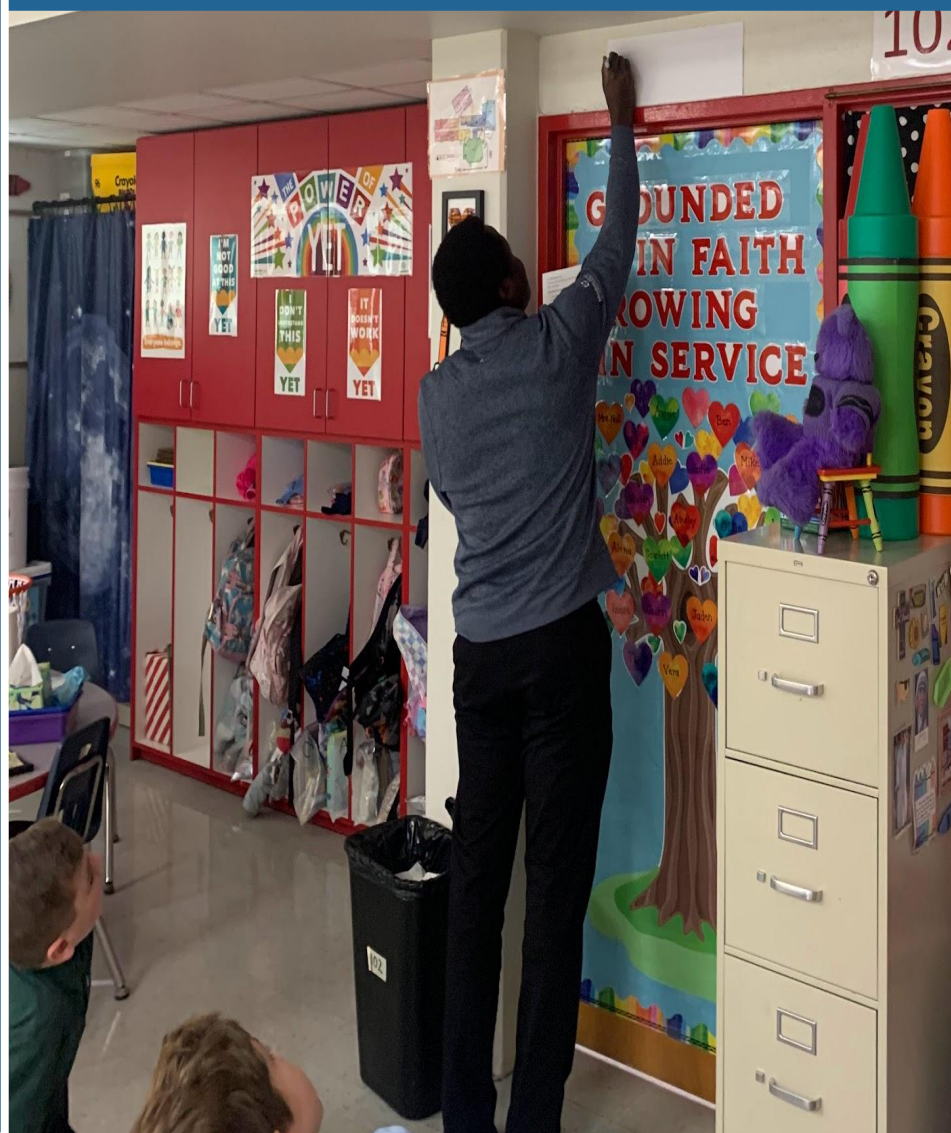


1st Grade Receives a Traditional Epiphany Blessing from Fr. Dominic

Registration for the 2026-2027 School Year Coming Soon!

- Registration for incoming Kindergarten students and Re -registration for Current Students will both begin on Sunday, January 25th, which is our Catholic School Week Open House from 9:30 am to Noon.
- We will again be using the FACTS online registration system.
- Additional information and enrollment instructions will be forthcoming.
- If you plan to enroll a new K student for next year, you will also need to complete the online FACTS application process. Those families with eligible children to attend K next year will be receiving an email from Mrs. Koch soon with instructions.



\$\$\$\$ FACTS Financial Update \$\$\$\$

- We are transitioning to a new platform within FACTS that will allow for a smoother and more efficient enrollment process. This updated system will enable families to complete enrollment in one step, without the back-and-forth communication with the office that has sometimes resulted in incomplete enrollments in the past.
- With this new format, tuition dollar amounts will not be displayed at the time of enrollment as they have been previously. Charges will appear once payment plans are finalized. Since enrollment is completed in April and tuition payments do not begin until July, there will be ample time to review and make adjustments to your payment plan once charges are visible.
- Additionally, SCL will now be using Electronic Rollover for returning students. In the past, families were required to re-enter their bank account or credit card information and select a payment plan each year. With Electronic Rollover, your existing payment plan and payment method will automatically carry over from year to year, eliminating the need for repeated setup. If you need to make any changes to your payment plan, you may still do so by contacting Penny Weiss in the parish office.
- **IMPORTANT: If your tuition is paid directly to SCL using a MOST 529 Plan account, a grandparent or parent check, or cash, please send an email to Penny Weiss for notification and prevention of auto payments occurring. THIS OPTION DOES NOT ROLLOVER.**

Virtue for January: Fidelity



Definition: Being faithful to promises and commitments

Mass: God shows his faithfulness through Jesus' offering of himself for us at each Mass.

School: Completing our homework on time, being a good classmate, and meeting other commitments.

Home: Performing our chores and loving our family.

Virtue Language:

What are some ways I can work this virtue into my language?

- "I like how (Name) is showing fidelity by..."
- I will be faithful to my commitments, even when I don't feel like it.

Remember: Fidelity strengthens our character and helps us and others grow in cheerfulness.

Showing Fidelity at Mass:

1. **Attending Mass every Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation.** Ask God to help you get to Mass regularly and consistently.
2. **Spend the quiet time before Mass speaking to God in your heart.** God is always there waiting for us and desires that we communicate with Him often.
3. **Listen to God speak to you in the readings.** Listen for examples of the ways God shows His faithfulness to His people.
4. **Say or sing the responses meaningfully.** Pay close attention to the words you are saying, and mean them from your heart.
5. **When distracted, quietly redirect yourself back to prayer.** We sometimes find ourselves distracted, but bringing our mind back to God shows our fidelity to Him.
6. **Receive the Eucharist like a faithful disciple of Christ.** Bow fully at the waist. Hold your hands chest high, one supporting the other, flat like a paten. Say "Amen" clearly, and reverently receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

2025 RECAP: WE ASKED, YOU RESPONDED, AND WE'RE LISTENING!

On behalf of the SCL Parish Pastoral Council, I want to first wish you a very Merry Christmas and a happy & holy new year in 2026!

This time of year, it's fun to think about all the unexpected events of the last 12 months, or maybe those things that just seemed so far off at the time, but which are now a reality. I mean, who would have thought that the lowly Chicago White Sox would become an overnight global brand all because of...the Pope!?!? That statement is total nonsense to a 2024 brain, but here we are!

Similarly, for the Parish Council, our *Big Rocks* we announced this time last year were just fledgling concepts aimed at a distant future but now have already begun to take shape and make an impact at SCL. Most significant is the Parish Survey we conducted this summer. Our objective was to hear from you directly and understand whether our current Mass schedule still optimally serves our parish. We asked what is working and what, if anything, you'd like to see different. Lastly, we were particularly interested in understanding your "why" behind the preferences you shared. You responded in a BIG way, and so we start by saying THANK YOU!!! The Council has spent the last several months critically analyzing the data, reading and listening to *every single one* of your responses, and discerning the best ways to meet them. Today we want to share with you the insights gathered from that process.

WHO RESPONDED?



557 unique responses were received from the survey



All age ranges were represented (under 18 to 90+)

- Highest response groups were 71-80, 61-70, and 41-50



Balanced representation based on the Mass time respondents currently attend most frequently

WHAT ARE OUR NEXT STEPS?



After prayerfully and thoroughly analyzing your feedback, the Parish Council is prepared to humbly recommend a revised Mass schedule to Fr. Dominic



We are currently collaborating with the Parish Staff and Liturgy Committee to develop a communication and implementation plan



We're excited to officially announce more details in the coming weeks and begin this new chapter at SCL later this summer!

WHAT DID WE LEARN?



Nearly 70% of parishioners favor a Saturday evening Mass starting before 5:00

- Opinion was shared across all age groups
- Most common reasons were driving after dark, family meal times, and young child schedules



There was an overwhelmingly strong preference for our existing 7:30 and 9:00 AM Sunday Masses

- These responses are reinforced by attendance trends at these times we've previously observed



Potential Mass time options between 10:00 and noon proposed in the survey showed a general indifference/lack of preference in responses

- No clear feedback trends that helped explain the "why"



In asking about a possible Sunday evening Mass option, only 35% indicated they would be "likely to attend at least monthly"



You shared other ideas to improve the Mass experience, including: more time and opportunity for fellowship between Masses, more impactful homilies, and a desire to connect the Scripture readings to your daily lives

We cannot thank you enough for sharing your voices with us, encouraging us, and ultimately entrusting us with this important work on behalf of and in support of our parish. Our hope is that, as Pope Francis urged, SCL will continue to help believers to grow spiritually so that they can respond to God's love ever more fully in their lives.

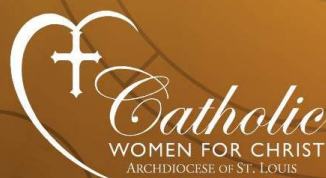
